## Self-rated Health by Sub-group

## **Highlights**

- Self-rated health is highest among those in the youngest age group 12 to 19 years (68.7%), with the highest incomes (71.3%), living in the least deprived areas (72.0%), those with some post-secondary (64.5%) or post-secondary graduates (62.7%) (Table 1).
