

Seven-year-old Measles (2 doses) Coverage by Rural Planning Zone (RPZ)

Highlights

- Measles coverage in 2015 varied by rural planning zone (Figure 1).
- Rosthern and Area had the lowest seven-year-old measles coverage, at 82.3%. This coverage rate may underestimate the coverage among children living on First Nations Reserves. See [About the Data](#). For coverage on First Nations Reserves contact [First Nations and Inuit Health](#).
- Watrous and Area had the highest coverage at 96.2%.
- Saskatoon and rural Saskatoon had decreases in coverage from the previous year (Table 1).
- Table 1 shows the historical trend for measles coverage at 7 years by RPZ.

Figure 1: Seven-year-old Measles (2 doses) Coverage Percent by Rural Planning Zone (RPZ), Saskatoon Health Region, 2015

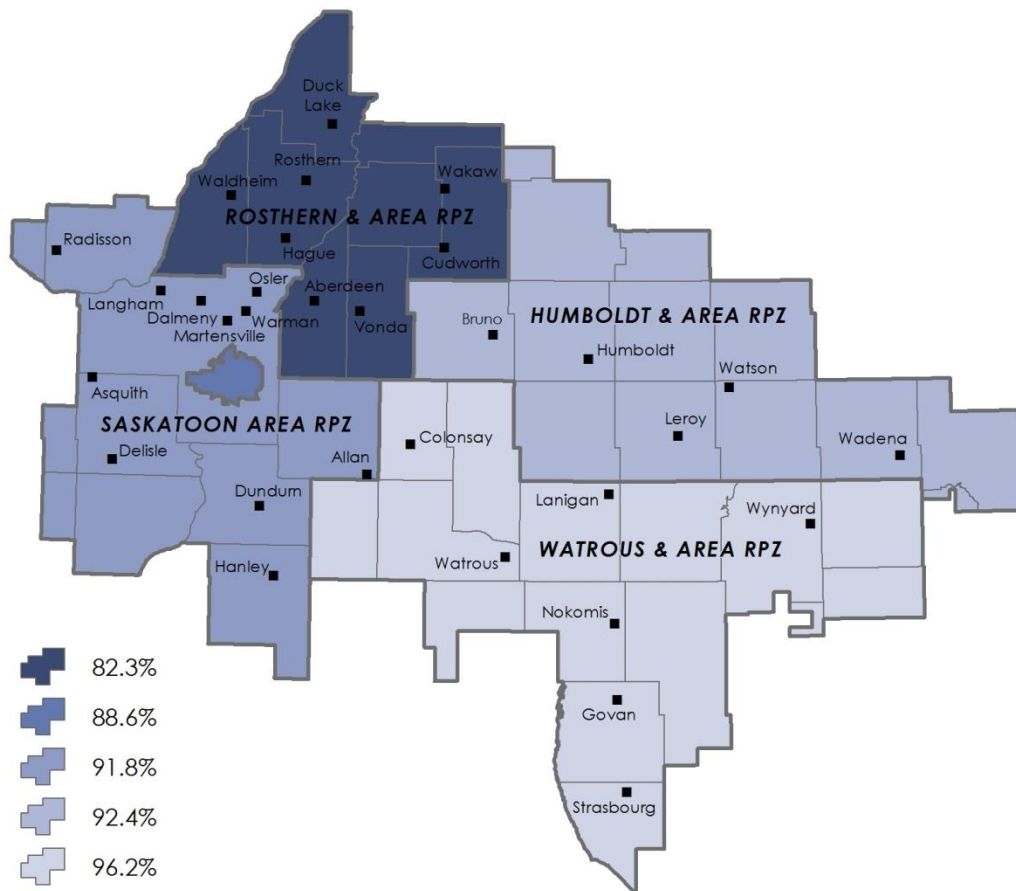
