

Gonorrhoea Rates by Gender and Age Group Saskatoon Health Region, 2011 to 2015

Highlights

- The highest gonorrhoea rates since 2011 are among females 15 to 24 years old.
- Rates have more than doubled in the 20 to 24 age group in five years. During this period eleven cases were reported in children under 15 (*not shown*).

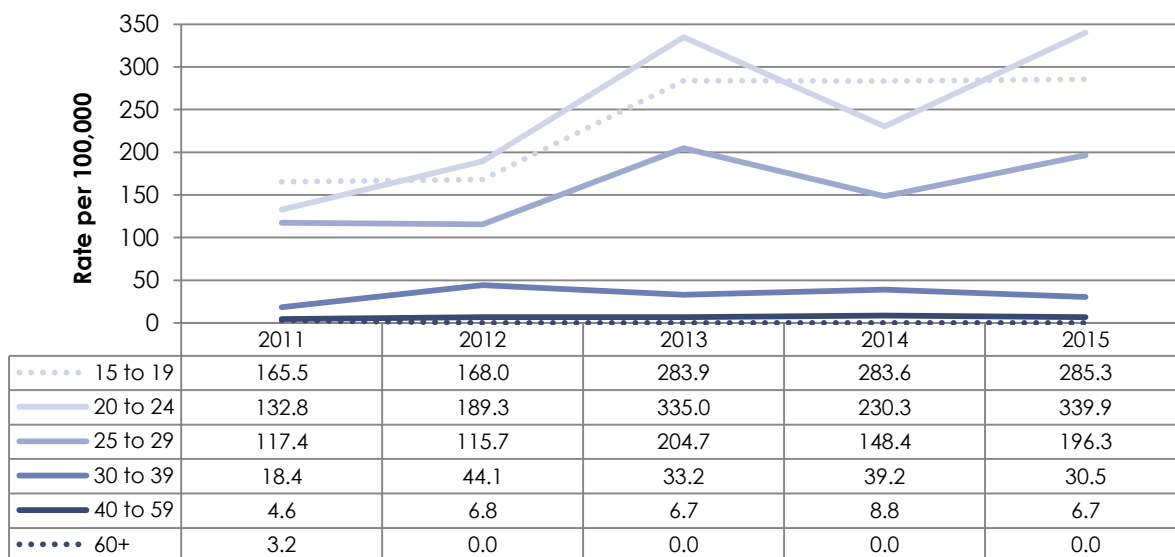
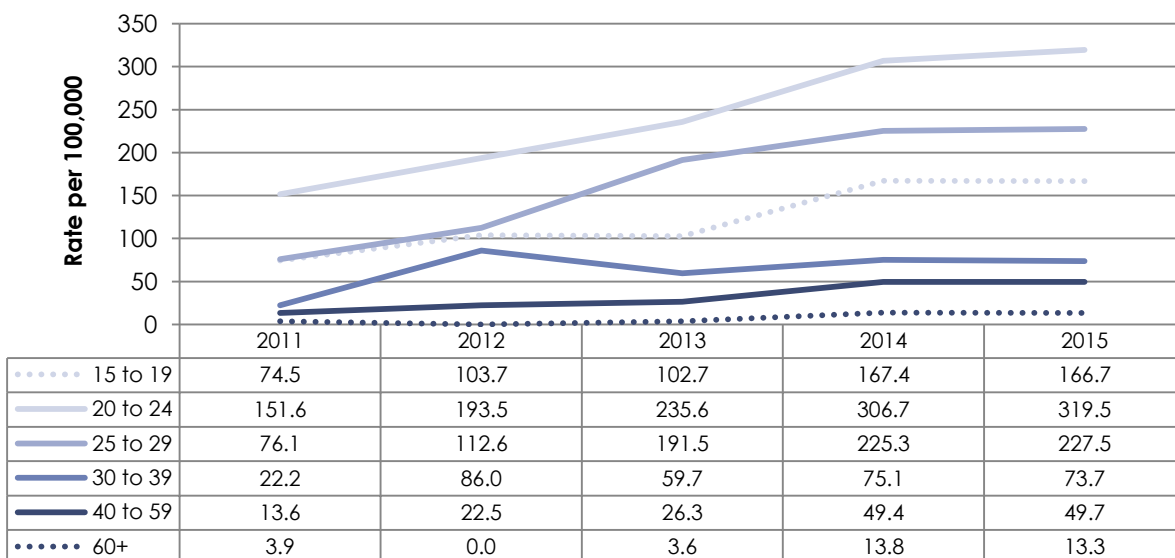


Figure 2: Male Gonorrhoea Rates per 100,000 Population by Selected Age Groups, Saskatoon Health Region, 2011 to 2015

- The highest gonorrhoea rate among males is in 20 to 29 year-olds. The rate has more than doubled for men 20 to 24 years old in this time period (*Figure 2*).

Figure 1: Female Gonorrhoea Rates per 100,000 Population by Selected Age Groups, Saskatoon Health Region, 2011 to 2015

Gonorrhoea Rates and Cases by Gender Saskatoon Health Region, 2006 to 2015

Highlights

- Gonorrhoea rates have risen and fallen cyclically in the Region over the past ten years (Figure 3).
- Female and male gonorrhoea rates were fairly equal until 2014 when male rates increased, largely, but not exclusively, due to an increase in infection among men who have sex with men (not shown).

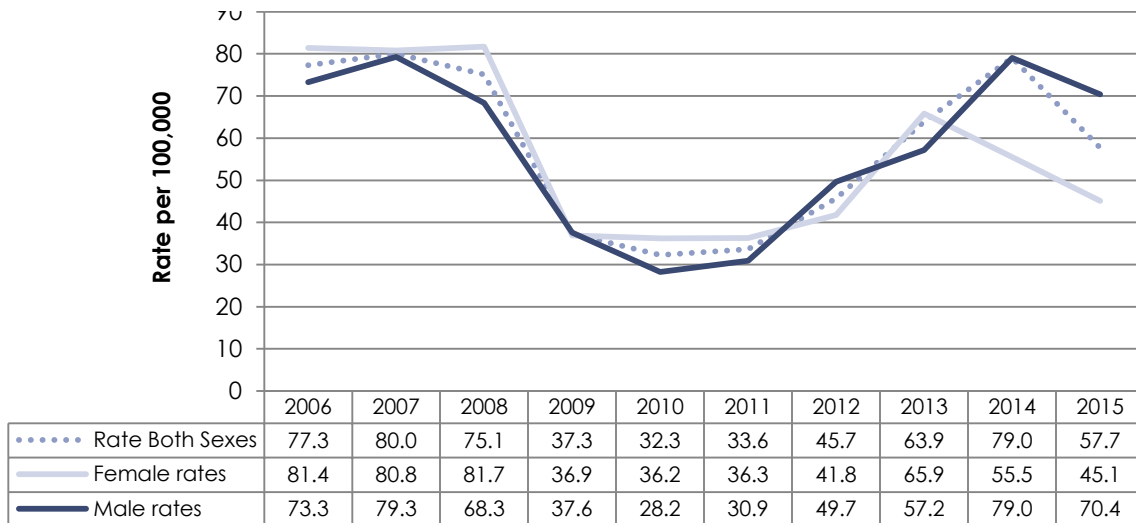
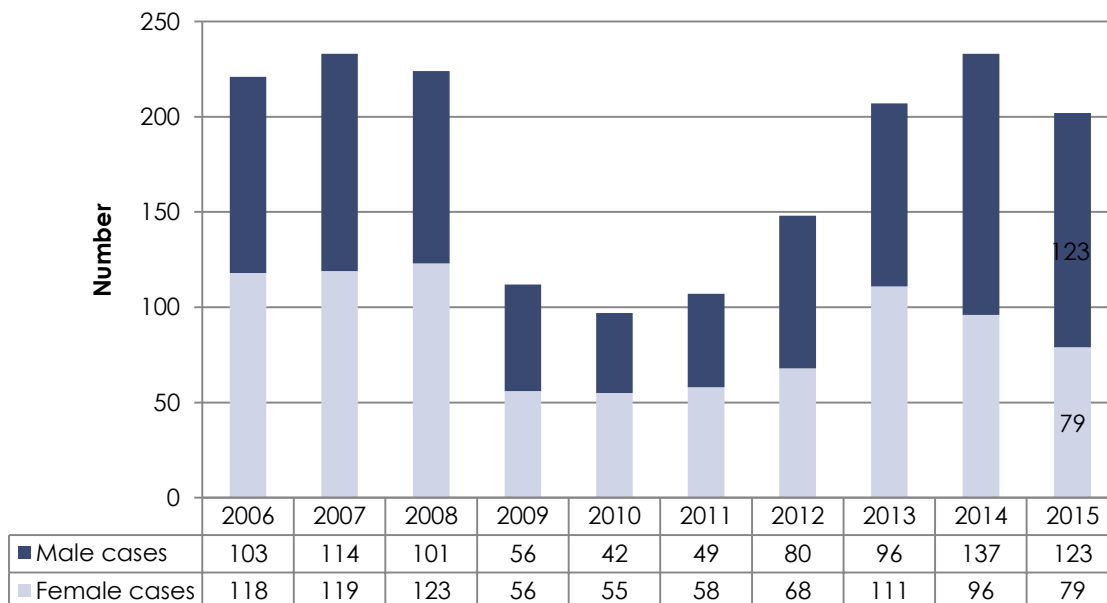


Figure 4: Gonorrhoea Cases by Gender, Saskatoon Health Region, 2006 to 2015

- The number of gonorrhoea cases in females and males was 79 and 123 cases respectively in 2015 (Figure 4).

Figure 3: Gonorrhoea Rates per 100,000 Population by Gender, Saskatoon Health Region, 2006 to 2015
