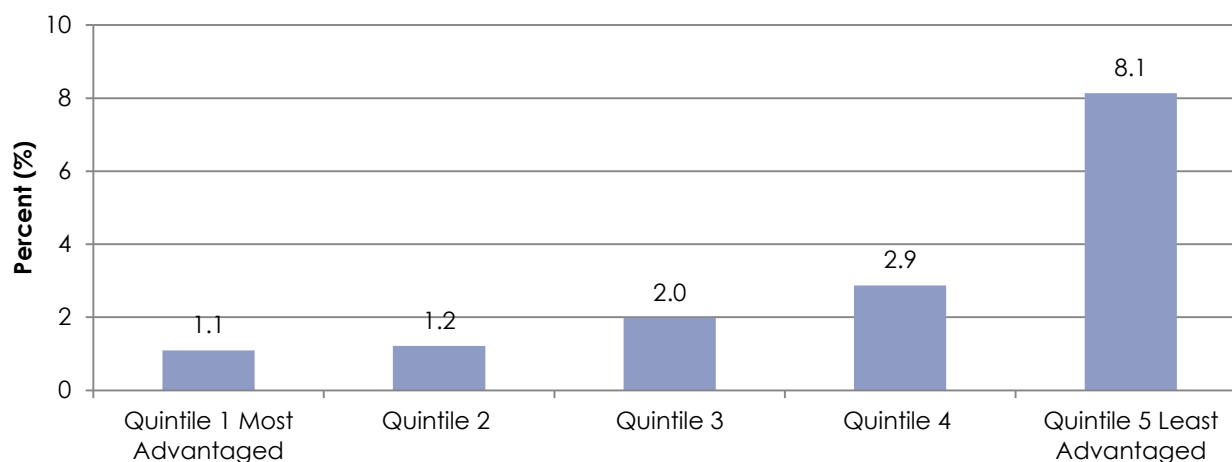


Maternal Alcohol and Drug Use Additional Data

Highlights

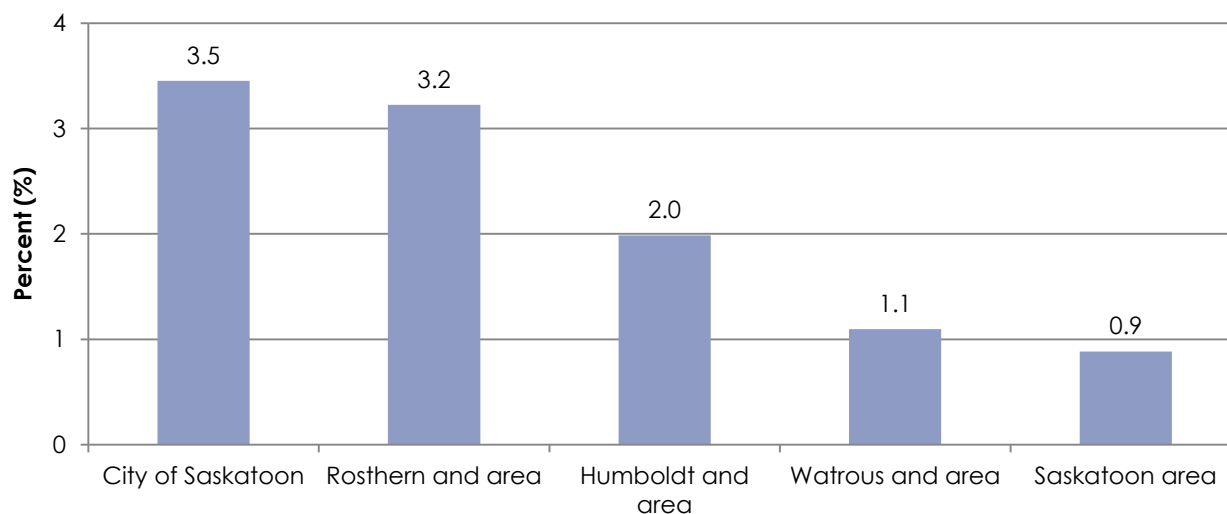
- Mothers living in least advantaged areas of Saskatoon were about eight times more likely to report drinking and drug use (8.1%) compared to those in the most advantaged areas (1.1%) for the years 2013 to 2016 combined (Figure 1).
- A higher proportion of mother's living in the City of Saskatoon and Rosthern areas reported alcohol or drug use (3.5 and 3.2% respectively) compared to mothers living in other areas of the Region (Figure 2).
- Almost 30% of women aged 15 to 44 reported heavy drinking in 2013/14. Data not shown, but more information on heavy drinking in Saskatoon Health Region shown [here](#).
