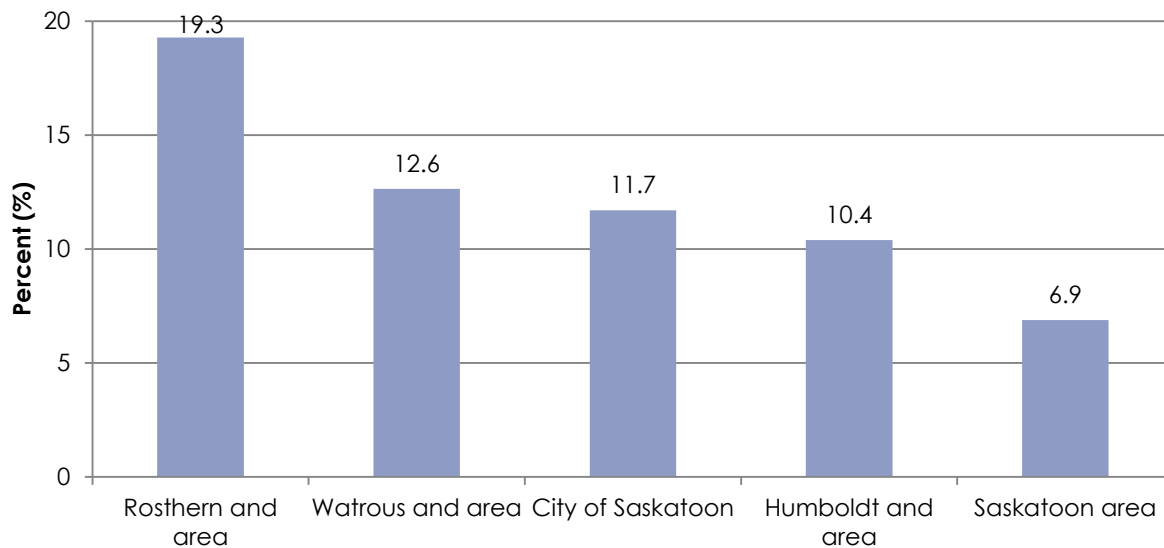


Maternal Smoking Additional Data

Highlights

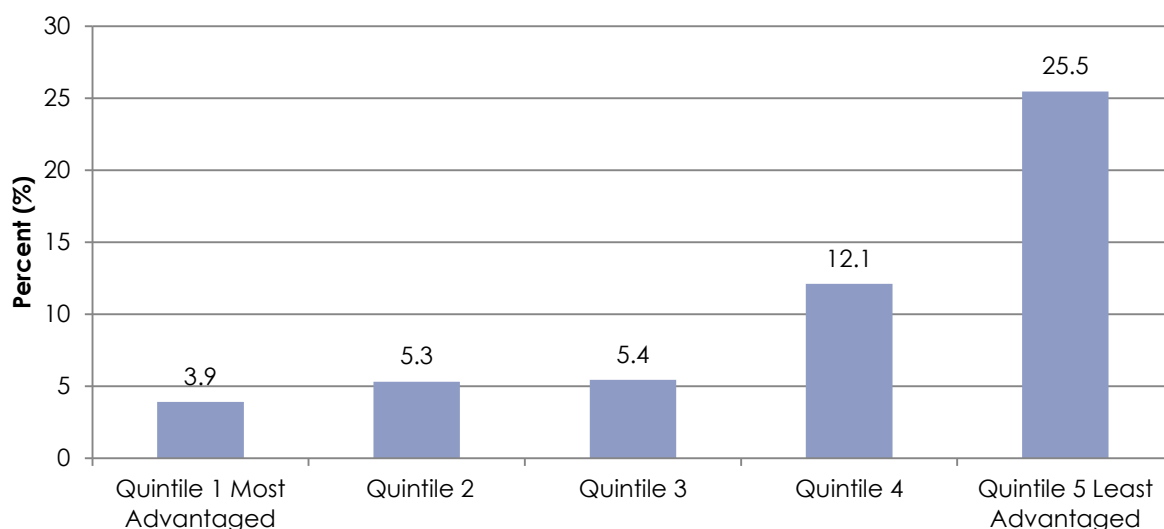
- A higher proportion of mothers from Rosthern and area reported a smoking history (19.3%) compared to mothers from other areas of the Region in 2016 (Figure 1).
- The smoking rates among mothers who live in areas of least advantage in Saskatoon were more than four times higher (25.5% vs. 3.9%) than the rates in the areas of most advantage in 2016 (Figure 2).
- About one in six (16.4%) females in the child bearing years, 15 to 44 years were current smokers in 2013-14 (data not shown). This equates to over 12,000 female smokers of child bearing years in the Region. The percentage of current smokers among females by age group have all decreased since 2011-12 (data not shown).
