

Gonorrhoea by Gender and Age Group Saskatoon Health Region, 2012 to 2016

Highlights

- Gonorrhoea rates have risen and fallen cyclically in the Region over the past ten years (Figure 3).
- Female and male gonorrhoea rates were fairly equal until 2014 when male rates increased, largely, but not exclusively, due to an increase in infection among men who have sex with men (not shown).
- In 2016 the number of gonorrhoea cases in females and males was 211 and 237 cases respectively (Figure 4).

Figure 1: Female Gonorrhoea Rates per 100,000 Population by Selected Age Groups, Saskatoon Health Region, 2012 to 2016

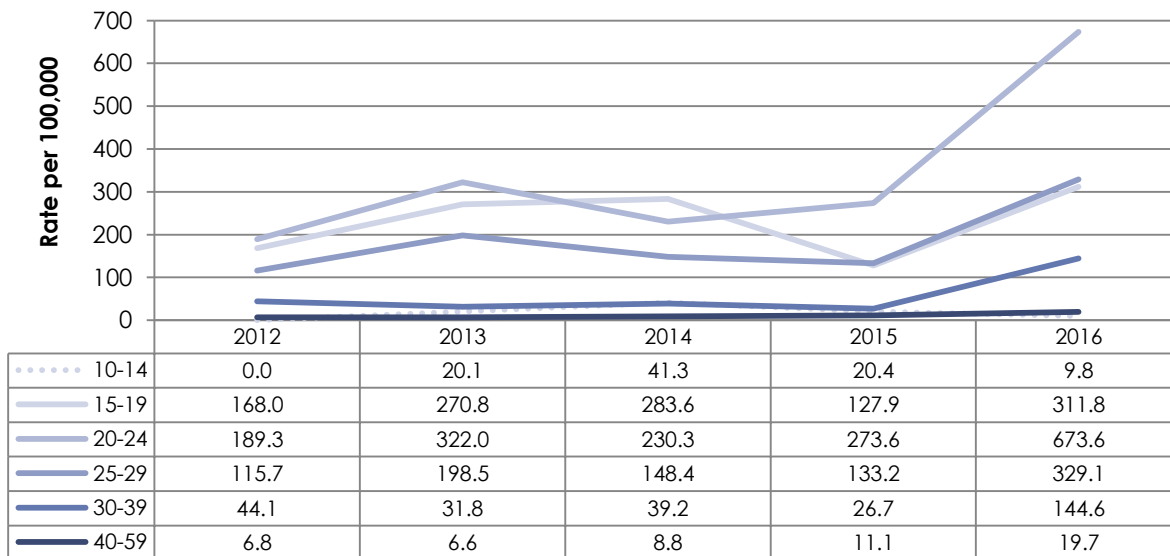
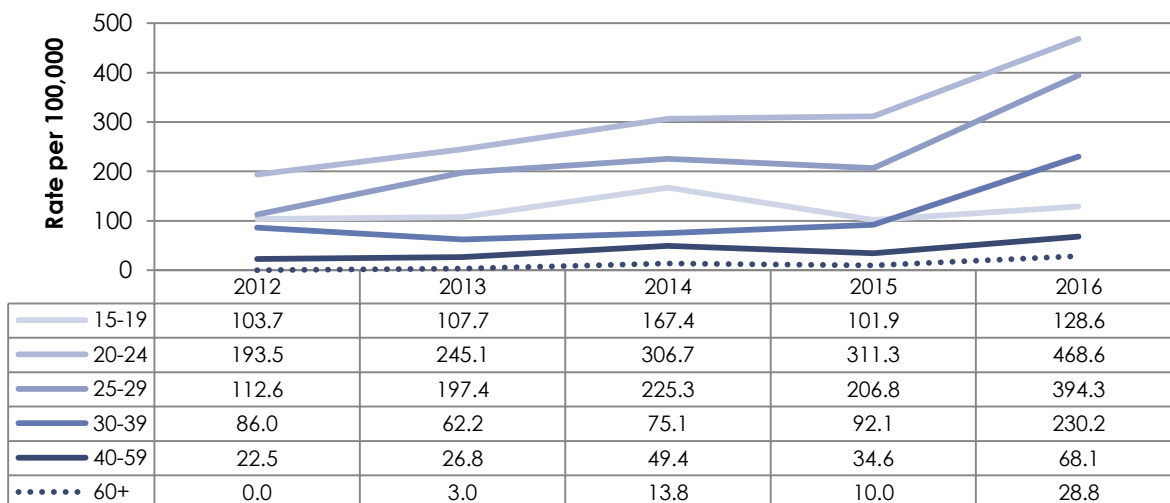


Figure 2: Male Gonorrhoea Rates per 100,000 Population by Selected Age Groups, Saskatoon Health Region, 2012 to 2016

Figure 3: Gonorrhea Rates per 100,000 Population by Gender, Saskatoon Health Region, 2007 to 2016

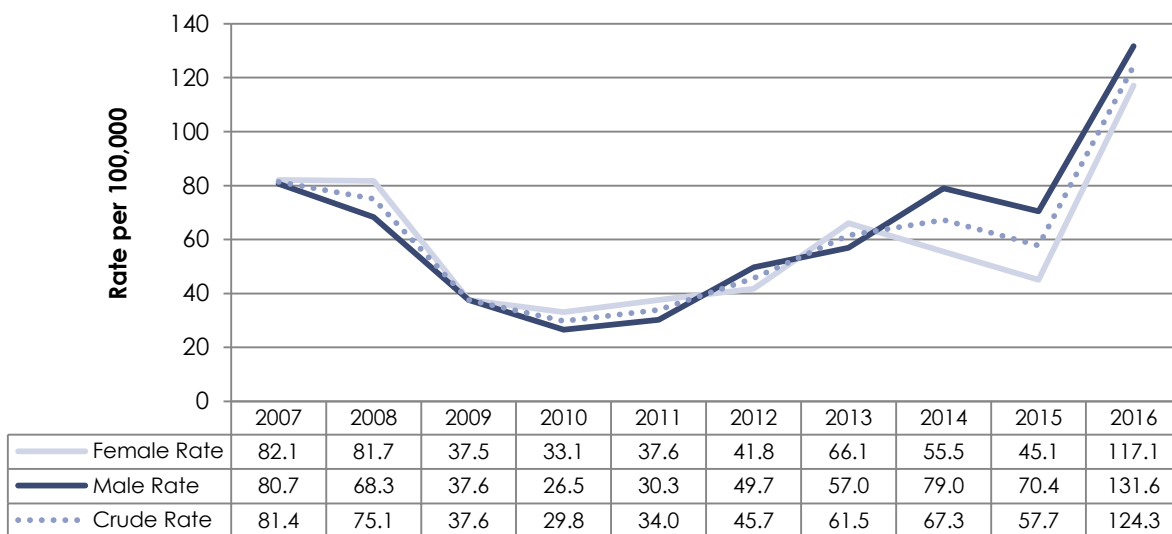
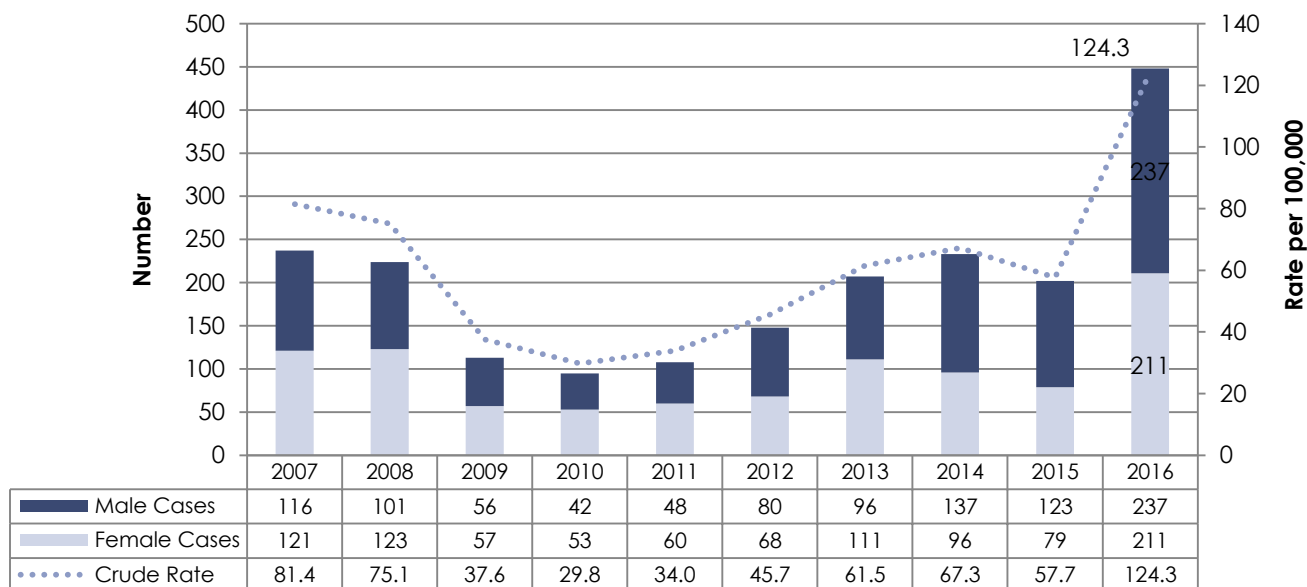


Figure 4: Gonorrhea Cases by Gender, Saskatoon Health Region, 2007 to 2016
